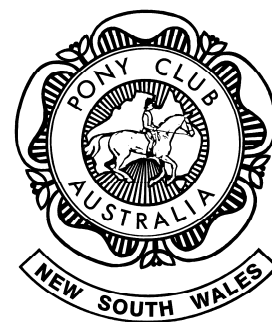

ENTRIES

All Entries must come through the Zone with one Zone cheque for the appropriate amount. Cheques will not be accepted from individual competitors or Clubs. Entries will only be accepted on the official Entry Forms accompanying this schedule.

CHAMPIONSHIP NOMINATION FORMS AND HORSE ID FORMS (DULY SIGNED BY THE ZONE CHIEF INSTRUCTOR) AND ONE DAY EVENT PERFORMANCE CARDS MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRIES FOR ALL COMPETITORS.

UNIFORM

Full Pony Club uniform is to be worn at this event (i.e. shirt and tie and either fawn or oatmeal jodhpurs) and to the Final Presentation Parade. White Jodhpurs are unacceptable.

SCRATCHINGS

To assist with the smooth running of championships, any scratchings should be notified to association office **as early as possible** on (02) 42298977 or fax (02) 42298966. Ground fees are refundable where scratchings are notified no later than 14 days prior to the event. Refund of entry fees will only be granted if a Doctors Certificate or a Veterinary Certificate can be produced and the office is notified immediately in writing.

ELIGIBILITY OF COMPETITOR

Competitors are required to have recorded attendance at a minimum of 3 Pony Club instructional days in the preceding 12 months. (State membership cards are available from the Association office @ \$0.75.) Verification of this is required by Club Secretaries prior to signing the Championship Nomination Form.

Entries will be accepted only from current financial and insured members of the Pony Club Association. New South Wales member's names must appear on the register at the PCA office.

NOTE: Zone Chief Instructors are required to list entries in order of priority on the entry forms. If there are too many entries in an age group, riders entered last on the form may not be accepted.

PERFORMANCE CARDS (New South Wales Competitors only)

All competitors must be graded by their Zone Chief Instructor to the correct grade for ODE State Championships (see below for grades). Nominations must be accompanied by photocopies of current One Day Event Performance cards (available from the Association office @ \$1.60). Club Secretaries are responsible to forward cards, with entry forms, to Zone Chief Instructors prior to approving entrants of suitable standard and forwarding nominations to Association office.

PLEASE NOTE: Photocopies of performance cards must be forwarded to the PCA office for State ODE Championships. These must be the correct grade and signed by the ZCI.

STANDARD OF COMPETITION

This is a State Championship and the standard of competition will be high. It is the responsibility of the Zone Chief Instructor to ensure that mounts are fit and meet the required standard and riders are capable of State Championship competition.

GENERAL RULES FOR STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Championship will be conducted under the rules of the Pony Club Association of NSW as set down in the current PCA Handbook and as advised in Council minutes to date. Team Managers to have a copy available for reference by their team members.

The Pony Club Association reserves the right to alter, amend or delete any part of this program if circumstances present.

INTERSTATE COMPETITORS

All interstate entries are the responsibility of their own State Association. Interstate entries must come through the State Secretary with an accompanying cheque. All correspondence will be forwarded to the State Secretary only.

All interstate competitors represent their State and must wear the full Pony Club uniform of their State Association. This includes State saddlecloths, flags, banners etc.

Interstate competitors ride under the rules of the Pony Club Association of NSW.

HORSE IDENTIFICATION

Horse ID forms are required to be sent to the PCA office with entries. Team Managers are required to have a copy of the Horse ID papers at the fitness check.

12 and under 15 years (Novice)	C grade
13 and under 15 years (Advanced)	B grade
15 and under 17 years (Novice)	B grade
15 and under 17 years (Advanced)	A grade
17 and under 25 years (Novice)	A grade
17 and under 25 years (Advanced)	Championship Grade

Individual awards to 10th placing.

Where there is a tie (after countback) the ribbon recipient will be decided by the flip of a coin, except for tenth place in which case extra ribbons will be provided.

STATE AND ZONE TEAMS

Eligibility is **Advanced Section** riders only.

INTERSTATE COMPETITION

One State Team Championship Award only. Teams to comprise of a maximum of four riders and a minimum of three riders. All scores to count.

INTER-ZONE COMPETITION (New South Wales Competitors only)

One Zone Team Championship Award only. Teams to comprise of a maximum of four riders and a minimum of three riders. All scores to count.

ACCEPTANCE FEE AND BACK NUMBERS

Back numbers will be issued to Team Managers on payment of an acceptance fee of \$10.00 per competitor. THIS ACCEPTANCE FEE must be paid before 6.00 pm on the day prior to competition, by Team Managers. Competitors not accepting and collecting their back numbers by the specified time will automatically be scratched from the event. This acceptance fee is refundable on return of the back number, providing the competitor has taken part in the competition and the back number is returned in good order. Team Managers are responsible for checking condition of back numbers and returning the same. Damaged back numbers will be charged to the Zone.

TEAM MANAGERS

Team Managers for each Zone must be named, together with addresses and telephone numbers, on the nomination form. For Team Managers duties see Current PCA Handbook. Team Managers must be current financial and insured members of the Pony Club Association and be suitably attired at all times. Team Manager badges to be worn (available at Association office for \$14.00). It is stressed that Team Managers are in charge of their team whilst ever they are on the ground and that any alcohol consumption should be strictly controlled.

Zone Secretaries are required to furnish each Team Manager with a list of members for whom they are responsible at State Championships, together with a list of scratchings, prior to departure for the Championship. Team members should be notified by Zone Secretary, through their Club Secretary, the name of their Team Manager for the Championship and be made aware of their responsibility to the Manager. This knowledge to be available to all team members prior to departing for the venue.

Team Managers must be suitably attired and wear identifying badges at all times. For distinguishing purposes it is recommended that Team Managers wear the uniform of their Zone.

JUMP JUDGES

Each Zone entering riders is required to nominate one cross country jump judge for the first 10 riders and one further cross country jump judge for every ten riders (or part thereof) thereafter.

Name and telephone numbers of Jump Judges to be attached to the entry form. All jump judges are required to report to the Secretary's office at 7.00 am on the morning of the Cross-country competition and PRIOR to taking up their positions on their respective jumps. Jump judges to report to the Scorer's room on the completion of judging and stay in this vicinity until all queries and/or protests have been resolved. Technical Delegate to advise judges when they are free to depart.

Jump judges are requested to bring a stopwatch.

DRESSAGE TESTS

12 and under 15 years (Novice)	1.C
13 and under 15 years (Advanced)	1.D
15 and under 17 years (Novice)	1.D
15 and under 17 years (Advanced)	2.A
17 and under 25 years (Novice)	2.A
17 and under 25 years (Advanced)	2.B

CROSS COUNTRY SPEED

Time for completing the course is calculated at:

Advanced 17 & under 25 years	500 metres per minute
Novice 17 & under 25 years	475 metres per minute
Advanced 15 & under 17 years	475 metres per minute
Novice 15 & under 17 years	450 metres per minute
Advanced 13 & under 15 years	450 metres per minute
Novice 12 & under 15 years	400 metres per minute

Time Limit is twice the time allowed.

Periods during which a competitor has been held up by a Jump Judge or Official, will be deducted from the actual time taken, to determine the correct time for completing the course. All jump judges will carry an accurate stopwatch for this purpose. Cross-country courses will be open for inspection to all interested persons at a time to be announced.

OPTIMUM TIME

Riders 17 years and under 25 years do not ride to optimum time.

Riders under 17 years will ride to optimum time (time allowed plus nothing less 20 seconds) before a time penalty is incurred.

An award for closest to optimum time on the cross-country will be awarded in each group to the rider with a clear cross country round who is closest to the optimum time.

WATCHES OR TIMEPIECES

With the exception of competitors in the 12 & Under 15 years Novice section, all competitors are permitted to carry a timepiece of any description during the cross-country phase.

SCORING

Individual Championship - In the event of a tied score, the following will apply

UNDER 17 YEARS	1.	Best Cross Country score
	2.	Closest to the Optimum time in the Cross Country phase
	3.	Total Dressage score
ASSOCIATES	1.	Best Cross Country score
	2.	Closest to the Optimum time in the Cross Country phase
	3.	Total Dressage score

If no result is determined, a count back is effected from the last collective dressage mark on the paper, upwards through the test.

Team Championship - If two Zones have equal aggregate scores, a count back is employed on major placings with teams, eg, two 1st placings coupled with one 4th placing (27 points) takes precedence over three 2nd placings (27 points). In the event of a tie still existing, preference is given to the competitors in the more senior age groups.

FITNESS CHECK

An inspection is conducted prior to the Dressage and Showjumping phases. The fitness check before the start of the Dressage phase will be conducted at 3:00 pm on the day prior to commencement of the Championship. The check will be carried out in Zones. Riders to be mounted and must wear full Pony Club uniform or a casual uniform of fawn jodhpurs, polo shirt in Club, Zone or State colours, together with regulation helmet and boots. Team managers to attend fitness check and have a copy of the Horse ID papers for each team member.

No horse under five (5) years of age will be eligible to compete. Horses to show all permanent teeth and the corners to be in wear. No other criterion is applicable.

It is the responsibility of the competitor and Team Manager to ensure that all horses receive a fitness inspection at the appointed time. A rider not complying with this requirement will be excluded from competition at the discretion of the Advisory Committee.

Horses are inspected under saddle. Saddles to be removed on request. A horse verified to be lame by the officiating veterinary surgeon at State Championships shall be scratched from the event by the Advisory Panel.

Suspect or doubtful horses may be asked to present for a further inspection by a veterinarian to make the final decision as to participation. Horses that fail to pass a veterinary inspection shall not be permitted to re-present at a fitness or veterinary inspection at the same Championships.

No horse may leave the ground after the fitness inspection at State Championships until the conclusion of the final parade without the permission of the Advisory Committee. A horse that is scratched as a result of the Fitness or Vet Check at a State Championship shall not be thereafter ridden at the venue by any person.

Destruction of severely injured horses - If a horse is so severely injured that on humanitarian grounds it has to be destroyed, the following procedure will apply: if the owner or his/her authorised representative is present, his/her agreement will first be obtained by the official Veterinary Surgeon. If the owner or his/her representative is not available the Technical Delegate, acting on the advice of the Official Veterinary Surgeon, may order the destruction of a horse.

Horses arriving during the night **ONLY** will be checked at 7.30 am on the first day of competition. Application to be made to Secretary by Team Manager on the day prior to the first day of competition.

GEAR INSPECTION

Competitors must, prior to each phase, present themselves to the Gear Steward in the appointed area with their Team Manager. After inspection the competitor will be checked off a list and is then not at liberty to leave the enclosure for any reason whatsoever, until after they have competed. The interference with or alteration of any gear what-so-ever, after the gear check, could entail disqualification of the competitor. This rule will be strictly supervised and adhered to. Team Managers are requested to co-operate.

Competitors only are permitted in the gear check area. Team managers to wait at gate in case of alteration to gear. In the case of problems, a competitor whose team manager is not present at the gear check area may not be allowed to compete.

EXERCISE

Competitors may exercise horses in area provided. Horses may only be exercised (this includes lunging) by their nominated riders, except in the case of riders under 13 years, when an adult member may lunge the horse with the permission of the Team Manager. Horses exercised by other than their riders (if the rider is 13 years or older) or with unacceptable gear, may be disqualified from the Championship as a whole.

PROTESTS

Protests must be lodged in writing, together with a fee of \$20.00 by Zone Team Manager only and handed to the Secretary on the ground. Protests must be made no later than one hour after the happening that gave rise to the protest, or in the case of scores, within fifteen minutes of the final championship scores being posted. Protests against the qualification of competitors or horses must be lodged not later than one hour prior to the commencement of the event.

DISQUALIFICATION

The PCA Executive, together with the Advisory Committee, has the power to disqualify any competitor for a breach of any rule, or for unacceptable behaviour.

PROFESSIONAL COACHING

Competitors may not be coached by professional coaches while at the venue, at the risk of disqualification from the Championship.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

At the conclusion of the state championship/s, team managers assemble ALL MEMEBERS of their teams, mounted and in full uniform (whether ribbon winners or not) for the final parade and presentations. The failure of any competitor to comply may well jeopardize the receiving of an award and/or future acceptance for championship competition. The only exception is when special permission has been granted by the advisory committee following written application from the team manager (see below).

APPLICATION FOR EARLY LEAVE

If, for any unforeseen circumstance, a competitor wishes to leave the venue prior to the final presentation of awards (whether they be ribbon winner or not), their Team Manager is required to make a written request to be lodged at the Secretary's office at the venue for decision by the Association Advisory Committee. Failure to obtain permission may jeopardise future entry.

RESPONSIBILITY

Neither the Organising Committee, the Pony Club Association of NSW, nor the Advisory Committee accepts any responsibility for accident or illness of horse, rider, groom, spectator or any other person, or damage to motor vehicle during the currency of the Championship. Riders ride at their own risk.

The Advisory Committee, together with the Executive of the PCA, are final arbiters in making decisions on protest or policy, and reserve the right to make any amendments, alterations or deletions to the programme as required.

ZONE FLAG/BANNER

Zone Team Managers are requested to bring banners for official parade. Team Managers to parade with Teams. Riders must wear full Pony Club uniform for the parade.

VEHICLE PARKING

NO vehicle is to park in an area allocated for horses. (Parking areas to be clearly indicated.) All vehicles park at their own risk. The host Zone will clearly mark and indicate camping & parking areas.

GROUND FEE

Ground fees are refundable where scratchings are notified no later than 14 days prior to the event, nomination fees will be refunded upon production of a doctors or veterinarian certificate.

STABLE FEE \$65 per competitor this includes dinner for rider

CAMPING FEE \$15.00 per site/family

Ground Fees are to be paid at the time of entry to Pony Club NSW.

Power is available at this site plus 2 large portable generators available 3 separate shower and toilet blocks on site. Stables and yards are allocated by the host Zone prior to the Championship. Prior bookings will not be taken
